It's always wonderful to hear when people we've helped at Open Door start going to church. To know that they are finding positive and supportive friendships, wise counsel and a hope for the future.

Through Open Door, we come into contact with people who are searching for something more. Something that alcohol or drugs won't satisfy. We come into contact with people who think that they've messed up their life and it's beyond redemption. And of course, the gospel message is an amazing one, where all are forgiven and all can start afresh.

When someone we're in contact with wants to ask about our faith, we're of course more than happy to chat. Then the obvious next step is to say 'why don't you visit a church?'

Are you/your church ready to love, walk alongside and not judge?

What sort of welcome would an alcoholic get if they walked through your church doors? Would they be smiled at, sat next to, invited for coffee and food after the service or during the week? What about if they turned up drunk? And how do you feel if the only reason someone wants to come to

church is because they're lonely? They have no interest in Jesus and they have no plans to change their behaviour (yet)?

It's not always easy but I think we should try to remember that we're all messy, just some of us hide it better than others. We all need forgiving, we all need saving. So let's treat everyone the same. Just like God treats us.

I heard Danielle Strickland talking recently about people she's working with (prostitutes, addicts etc) as equals and as friends. She has as much to gain and to learn from knowing them as they do from her. Amen.

#### Volunteers needed!

Firstly, a big thank you to those who have volunteered to help Nightshift recently it's a real answer to prayer and we're looking forward to welcoming you to the team! We still need 2 more Nightshift volunteers ideally so if you or someone you know might be interested, please do get in touch. We can arrange for a trial night out with the team so you can watch how things unfold and decide if it's right for you. The key is simply if you have a heart for those who are struggling in Exmouth on a Saturday night. That might be a young person who has had too much to drink and needs help getting home safely, or simply listening to someone

who needs to talk.

We are also in need of a few more volunteers in the café and at the child contact centre. We are finding that these services are busier than ever so it would really help us to have a few extra people to make sure that the volunteers we've got aren't being too stretched.

If you're not sure if you can offer a regular commitment but would still like to be involved, we would like to set up 'emergency lists' for each project so if we ever find ourselves short at the last minute, we have a bank of people to call.
