Get Luspited!

There are lots of ways you can raise money for Open Door Exmouth. Whatever you get up to, everything you raise will go towards helping those most vulnerable in our community and making a positive difference for all.

Raise sponsorship... 5k, 10k, half or full marathon, swimathon, walking, roller skating, cycling, triathlon, sponsored silence, sponsored slim, rowing, skydive, mountain climb, abseil, shave your head/beard/legs! Or how about Exmouth's Christmas Day Swim?

Charge a fee... music concert, golf tournament, football tournament, open mic night, cricket match, quiz night, dinner dance, safari supper, chess tournament, School Sports Day, It's a Knockout, Tug of War, pool or darts competition, tennis tournament, treasure hunt, board game tournament, BBQ, art exhibition, barn dance, car boot sale, disco, stand up comedy night, photo competition, pantomime, duck race, picnic, tea party, teddy bear's picnic, inter church/office university challenge

Shake a bucket... supermarket bag packing, carol singing, dress down day at work, ask for donations in lieu of gifts at a party or wedding, cake sale, coffee morning, raffle, tombola, (silent) auction, heads or tails, bob a job, car washing, dog walking, bring and buy sale, clothes exchange, busking, cooking competition (cakes, ready steady cook, come dine with me etc!), Easter Egg hunt, Christmas fair, fashion show, pet show, plant sale

Save the pennies... collect pennies, small change, foreign coins. Fill jam jars, smartie tubes, even pringle tubes! Even better if a group of you commit to doing it!

Or give up expensive habits for a week, month, year or forever, and donate the money you would have spent on... smoking, alcohol, coffee, cakes, chocolate, driving, junk food, magazines, meat etc etc!

Some tips to help you make the most of your fundraising...

Get planning

Careful planning will help ensure your fundraising is a success. It is worth checking: whether your date clashes with any other big events in the area; if you've allowed enough time to organise everything, and whether you've got all the equipment and supplies you need. Remember you can contact us for collecting buckets and shaky tins, posters, banners, sponsorship forms and balloons!

Go online

Setting up an online fundraising page makes collecting sponsorship and donations and claiming Gift Aid really easy. It's also a great way of spreading your fundraising to friends and family who don't live in your area. To set up your page, go to: https://www.justgiving.com/jqfrhcwedy, click 'Fundraise for us' and follow the simple instructions.

Be safe and legal

You need to make sure your event meets health and safety requirements. If there are a large number of people attending, you may need first aid cover. If you're preparing food, check food.gov.uk for guidelines. If you think you need insurance, contact 01395 224218 for more info. Also check gamblingcomission.gov.uk for info about laws relating to raffles and lotteries. Please remember, if you are collecting money in a public place you will need permission from the owner of the premises, or the local authority if you're collecting in the street. Finally, if you are holding an event, you may need an alcohol or entertainment license, check with your local authority.

Go public

To spread the news of your fundraising far and wide, send press releases to the local papers and radio stations (contact us on 01395 224218 or info@opendoorexmouth.org.uk for a template press release). Remember to use facebook and twitter as well!

Watch the pennies

Use sponsorship forms and other records to keep track of your donations and any money you've spent. When it comes to paying the money in, ideally take the money to your bank, get a receipt for the money you've paid in, and write us a cheque made out to 'Open Door Exmouth'. If you can't do this, contact us on 01395 224218 or at info@opendoorexmouth.org.uk for further advice.

Finally, have fun!
